Individuals have a right to include an advocate in meetings with University administrators, law enforcement, medical personnel, and in court proceedings.

A sexual assault medical exam ensures:

- Physical injuries that may have occurred are promptly identified and addressed.
- Individuals receive medication for prevention of pregnancy and STIs.
- Evidence is collected by a Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner and preserved for a criminal investigation or University complaint now or in the future.
